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1 STUDY OVERVIEW

(From IRB submission)

The purpose of the study was to better understand the general health of residents within the Thomas Jefferson Health District (TJHD) by specific geographic groupings.

The data collection began in June 2018 and ended in July 2018. The study targeted adults (age 18 and older) who are residents of the Thomas Jefferson Health District. Households included in the study were randomly selected from a purchased, address-based sampling frame of households in the Thomas Jefferson Health District. The sample was stratified to target ZIP codes (ZCTAs) that have similar demographic characteristics, as identified by a prior cluster analysis of ZCTAs based on U.S Census data.

Recruitment and data collection was done through postal mail. The mailed materials included one advance letter, two questionnaire packets, and one thank you/reminder postcard. The respondents mailed back the survey in a pre-paid postage envelope, and used a separate post card to communicate that they had completed the questionnaire. The questionnaire was developed by the Thomas Jefferson Health District and modified and formatted by the University of Virginia Center for Survey Research.

2 ANALYSIS METHODS

This file contains the results for each of the geographic regions of interest, and for the entire TJHD. For each categorical survey question, the weighted percentage and 95% confidence intervals (CI) are shown. The survey weights for TJHD, and each geographic region, were generated by the Center for Survey Research.

The following statistical terms have been used in this report and a brief definition of each is given.

Term (symbol)	Brief Definition
Frequency (n)	A count of the respondents who selected a survey response.
Percentage (%)	A count of the respondents who selected a survey response divided by the
Confidence interval (CI)	Provides a range of values around the estimate, within which the true value can be expected to fall. The smaller the confidence interval is for a particular estimate, the more precise the estimate is.

Cells marked with a "-" indicate no survey respondent selected this answer and population level estimates are unknown. This does <u>not</u> mean 0% of the population/county have this characteristic, rather that we have no data to know what the "truth" might be.

Analyses were conducted using StataSE 15¹.

3 RESULTS

3.1 THOMAS JEFFERSON HEALTH DISTRICT

A total of 934 respondents were from the TJHD. Once weighted for the sampling design, the weighted frequency is 934 respondents. The weighted frequencies, percentages and 95% CI for the percentages by county of respondent are shown in Table 3.1.1.

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


Figure 3.1.1: Estimated population percentages by age group and geographic region
