Dear Mr. Stevens:

In accordance with Chapter 4, Article 1.1 of Title 32.1 of the Code of Virginia of 1950 (the Code), as amended, I reviewed the application and all supporting documents submitted by Kaiser Foundation Health Plan of the Mid-Atlantic States, Inc. to establish a specialized center for CT and MRI services by relocating and replacing existing CT and MRI equipment currently located in Woodbridge, to add one MRI, to establish non-cardiac nuclear medicine services and to establish PET/CT services with one PET/CT scanner.

As required by Section 32.1-102.3B of the Code, I have considered all factors that must be taken into account in a determination of public need, and I have concluded that **conditional** approval of the request is warranted based on the following findings:

- 1. The project is generally consistent with the applicable criteria and standards of the State Medical Facilities Plan and the eight Required Considerations of the Code of Virginia.
- 2. A reasonable, less costly, more efficient alternative to the proposed project does not exist.



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- 3. The Board of the Health Systems Agency of Northern Virginia recommended approval of the proposed project.
- 4. Approval of the proposed project is not likely to have a negative impact on the costs or utilization of existing providers.
- 5. There is no known opposition to the proposed project.
- 6. The projected capital costs are reasonable.

This certificate is valid for the period February 18, 2020 through February 17, 2021. The total authorized capital cost of the project is \$12,895,042

Please file two copies of the application for a certificate extension with the Department and one copy with the regional health planning agency no later than 30 days before the expiration date of the certificate. Part VIII of the Virginia Medical Care Facilities Certificate of Public Need Rules and Regulations identifies the filing requirements and review procedure for certificate extension requests.

SCOPE OF PROJECT: Establish a specialized center for CT and MRI imaging services by relocating and replacing existing costs associated with this project total 12,895,042. The project is expected to be complete by November 1, 2021. This certificate one CT scanner and one MRI scanner currently located in Woodbridge, Virginia, Add one MRI scanner for a total of two MRI scanners. Establish non-cardiac nuclear medicine services. Establish PET/CT services with one PET/CT scanner. The capital is issued with the condition that appears on its reverse.
