In accordance with Chapter 4, Article 1.1 of Title 32.1 of the Code of Virginia of 1950 (the Code), as amended, I reviewed the application and all supporting documents submitted by Inova Health System to expand CT services by adding one intraoperative CT scanner at Winchester Medical Center.

As required by Section 32.1-102.3B of the Code, I have considered all factors that must be taken into account in a determination of public need, and I have concluded that **conditional approval** of the request is warranted based on the following findings:

- 1. The project is generally consistent with the applicable criteria and standards of the State Medical Facilities Plan and the eight Required Considerations of the Code of Virginia.
- 2. The project is more favorable than the alternative of the status quo.
- 3. The project proposes to introduce a new application of the CT imaging technology into the operating room, with the potential to improve patient outcomes.
- 4. There is no known opposition to the project.
- 5. The capital and financing costs are reasonable.



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This certificate is valid for the period February 18, 2020 through February 17, 2021. The total authorized capital cost of the project is \$1,744,450.

Please file two copies of the application for a certificate extension with the Department no later than 30 days before the expiration date of the certificate.
