Dear Ms. Martin:

In accordance with Chapter 4, Article 1.1 of Title 32.1 of the Code of Virginia of 1950 (the Code), as amended, I reviewed the application and all supporting documents submitted by Virginia Commonwealth University Health System Authority to add 58 medical-surgical beds and 14 intensive care unit beds.

As required by Section 32.1-102.3B of the Code, I have considered all factors that must be taken into account in a determination of public need, and I have concluded that **conditional** approval of the request is warranted based on the following findings:

- The project is generally consistent with the applicable criteria and standards of the Medical Facilities Plan and the Eight Required Considerations of the Code of Virginia.
- 2. The applicant has adequately demonstrated an institutional need to expand its existing inventory of medical-surgical and intensive care unit beds.
- 3. There is a calculated deficit of intensive care unit beds in PD 15.
- 4. There is no known opposition to the proposed project.
- 5. The project is financially feasible.

- 6. The projected capital costs are reasonable.
- 7. Approval of the proposed project is not likely to have a significant impact on existing providers of inpatient beds services.
