Dear Ms. Towey:

In accordance with Chapter 4, Article 1.1 of Title 32.1 of the Code of Virginia of 1950 (the Code), as amended, I reviewed the application and all supporting documents submitted by Augusta Health Care, Inc. d/b/a Augusta Health to add one CT scanner.

As required by Section 32.1-102.3B of the Code, I have considered all factors that must be taken into account in a determination of public need, and I have concluded that **conditional approval** of the request is warranted based on the following findings:

- 1. The project is generally consistent with the applicable criteria and standards of the State Medical Facilities Plan and the eight Required Considerations of the Code of Virginia.
- 2. The applicant has demonstrated an institutional need to expand CT imaging capacity.
- 3. The project is more favorable than the alternative of the status quo.
- 4. There is no known opposition to the project.
- 5. The capital and financing costs are reasonable.
- 6. The project appears to be economically feasible both in the immediate and long-term.
- 7. The project establishes a lower cost imaging option for residents of PD 6.
