Dear Mr. Stallings:

In accordance with Chapter 4, Article 1.1 of Title 32.1 of the Code of Virginia of 1950 (the Code), as amended, I reviewed the application and all supporting documents submitted by HCA Health Services of Virginia, Inc. to convert the existing mobile PET/CT service at Henrico Doctors' Hospital-Forest to a fixed-site service with one fixed-site PET/CT scanner.

As required by Section 32.1-102.3B of the Code, I have considered all factors that must be taken into account in a determination of public need, and I have concluded that **conditional approval** of the request is warranted based on the following findings:

- 1. The proposed project is generally consistent with the applicable criteria and standards of the State Medical Facilities Plan and the Eight Required Considerations of the Code of Virginia.
- 2. The capital costs are reasonable.
- 3. The proposed project appears economically viable in the immediate and in the long-term.
- 4. There is no known opposition to the proposed project.
- 5. The project is more favorable than maintaining the status quo.

This certificate is valid for the period February 15, 2021 through February 14, 2022. The total authorized capital cost of the project is \$3,979,077.
