Dear Mr. Howell:

In accordance with Chapter 4, Article 1.1 of Title 32.1 of the Code of Virginia of 1950 (the Code), as amended, I reviewed the application and all supporting documents submitted by Community Memorial Hospital to expand its CT services through the addition of one fixed CT scanner.

As required by Section 32.1-102.3B of the Code, I have considered all factors that must be taken into account in a determination of public need, and I have concluded that **conditional approval** of the request is warranted based on the following findings:

- 1. The project is consistent with the applicable criteria and standards of the State Medical Facilities Plan and the Eight Required Considerations of the Code of Virginia.
- 2. The project would address the overutilization of the existing CT scanner at Community Memorial Hospital
- 3. There is a calculated deficit of CT scanners in the planning district.
- 4. The status quo is not a viable alternative to the proposed project.
- 5. The capital costs are reasonable and consistent with the projects of this type.

This certificate is valid for the period November 9, 2021 through November 8, 2022. The total authorized capital cost of the project is \$1,981,232.
