Dear Mr. Stallings:

In accordance with Chapter 4, Article 1.1 of Title 32.1 of the Code of Virginia of 1950 (the Code), as amended, I reviewed the application and all supporting documents submitted by Reston Hospital Center, LLC to add two general-purpose operating rooms at Reston Hospital Center.

As required by Section 32.1-102.3B of the Code, I have considered all factors that must be taken into account in a determination of public need, and I have concluded that **approval** of the request is warranted based on the following findings:

- 1. The project is generally consistent with the applicable criteria and standards of the State Medical Facilities Plan and the eight Required Considerations of the Code of Virginia.
- 2. The proposed project would address the calculated deficit of general-purpose operating rooms in the health planning district.
- 3. The applicant has demonstrated an institutional need to expand.
- 4. The capital costs associated with this project are reasonable.
- 5. There are no reasonable, less costly, more efficient alternatives to the proposed project.
- 6. The proposed project appears economically viable in the immediate and in the long-term.



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7. The Health Systems Agency of Northern Virginia recommended approval of the proposed project.

This certificate is valid for the period January 10, 2022 through January 9, 2023. The total authorized capital cost of the project is \$4,507,000.

Please file two copies of the application for a certificate extension with the Department no later than 30 days before the expiration date of the certificate. Part VIII of the Virginia Medical Care Facilities Certificate of Public Need Rules and Regulations identifies the filing requirements and review procedure for certificate extension requests.

SCOPE OF PROJECT: Add two general-purpose operating rooms at Reston Hospital Center, for a total complement of 17 general-purpose operating rooms. Capital costs associated with this project total \$4,507,000. The project is expected to be completed by May 31, 2024.
